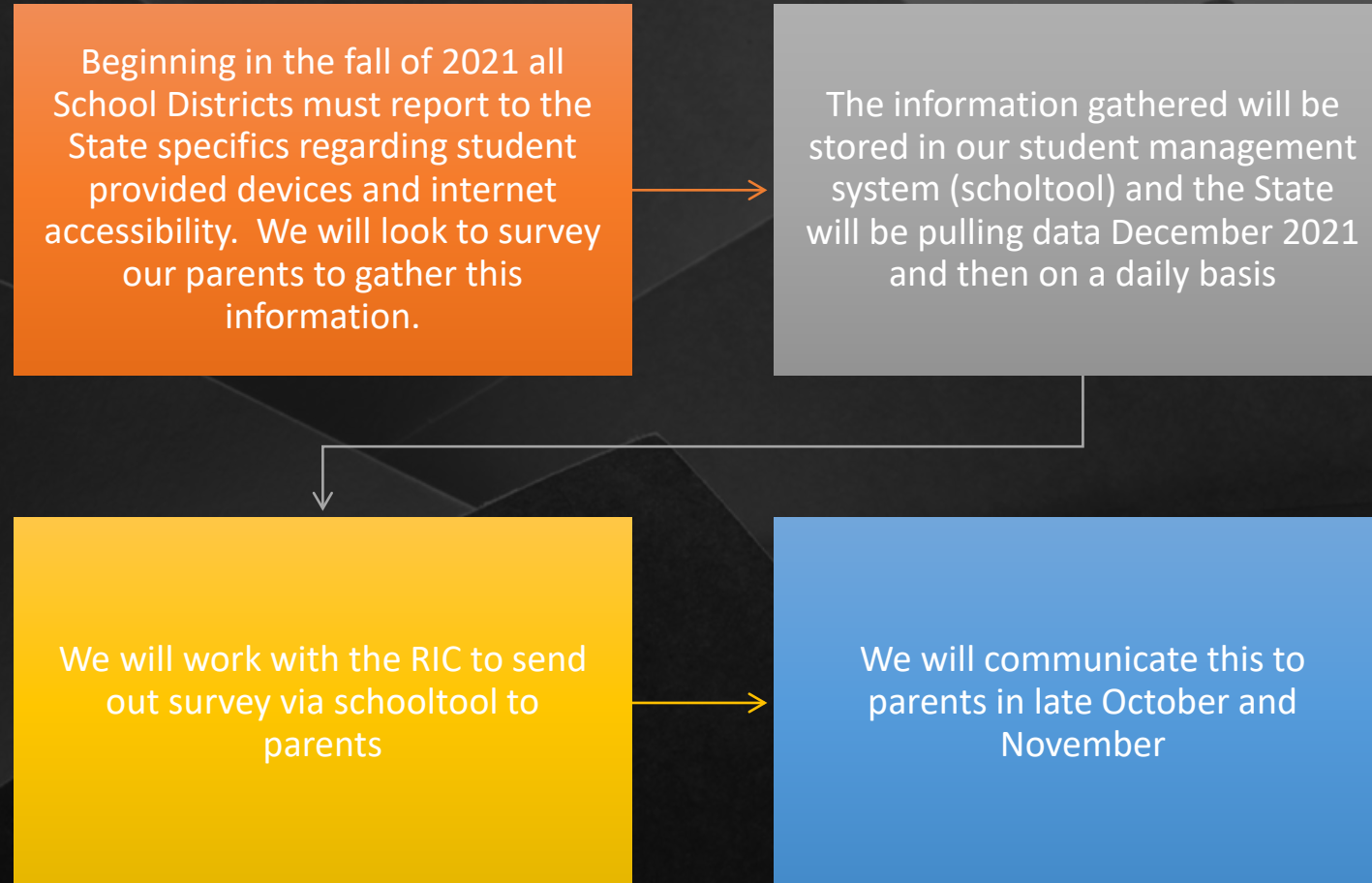
New York State Technology Data Reporting Requirement

Beginning in the fall of 2021 all School Districts must report to the State specifics regarding student provided devices and internet accessibility. We will look to survey our parents to gather this information.

The information gathered will be stored in our student management system (scholtool) and the State will be pulling data December 2021 and then on a daily basis

We will work with the RIC to send out survey via schooltool to parents

We will communicate this to parents in late October and November



Survey Questions

Question 1: Did the school district issue your child a dedicated school or district-owned device for their use during the school year?

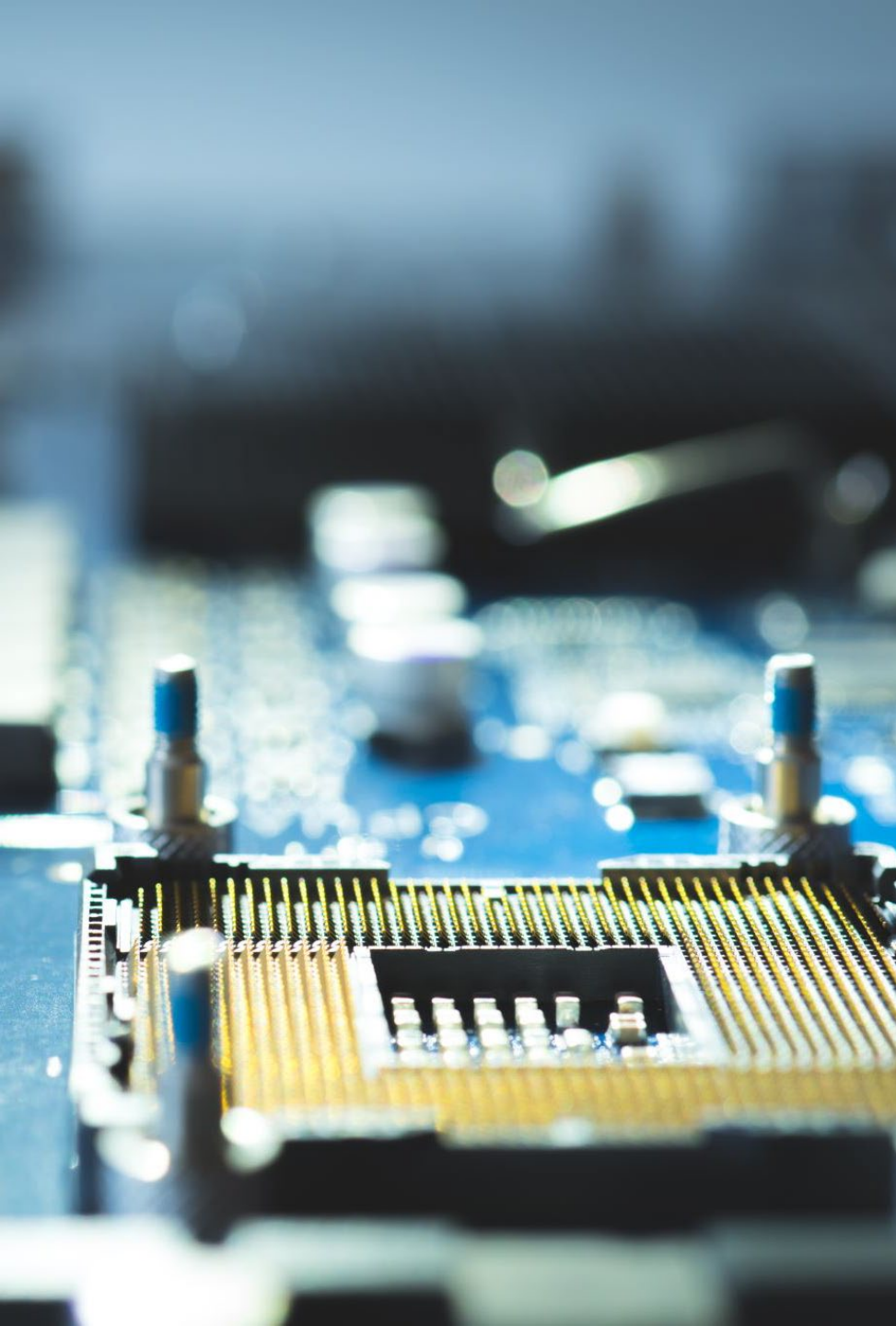
